

WEEK 3: I AM THE GOOD SHEPHERD

John 10:11-16, 10:27-30

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What part of the teaching stood out most to you? Why?
2. The Bible often refers to people as sheep. Which attribute of sheep that was mentioned this week stood out to you the most (i.e. they can't provide for themselves, they can't clean themselves, they can't lead themselves, etc.)? How does this comparison with sheep help you understand yourself better?
3. This week, Pastor Ryan said that the more beautiful Jesus is to us the more we see how ugly our sin is. What about Jesus is beautiful to you? Do you see your sin as ugly or does it still look good to you?
4. The second point from this week's teaching says that Jesus is connected to us. He knows YOU personally. Do you believe this? How does this truth impact you? What are some ways that you have experienced this connection?
5. One of the main points this week was that "The Good Shepherd is Relentless". In this, we see Jesus' heart for the lost. Do you have a heart for the lost? What are some ways that we can take part in God's mission to bring the lost sheep in?
6. The final point this week was "The Good Shepherd Can Be Trusted". What does it look like to trust Jesus with your life? How does trusting Jesus with your life affect your day-to-day actions and decisions?
7. Have someone read Psalm 23 for the group. What sticks out to you from this Psalm? How does this Psalm encourage you?
8. What are some ways that Jesus shows His devotion to us as our Good Shepherd?
