Proverbs 21:5, 16:33, 16:9, 16:4, 16:3

- 1. GOD'S GUIDANCE IS PARADOXICAL
- 2. GOD'S GUIDANCE IS NOT OBVIOUS

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What part of this past Sunday's teaching stood out most to you? Why?
- 2. This week's message was all about God's guidance. What's the best guidance that another person has ever given you? What's the worst guidance someone has given you?
- 3. The first main idea this week was that "God's Guidance is Paradoxical." Proverbs shows us that our decisions matter AND that the outcome of our plans and actions belong to God (Prov. 21:5, Prov. 16:33, Prov. 16:9). How can both of these be true at the same time? What are some reasons why it is important that we understand both of these statements are true?
- 4. The second main idea this week was that "God's Guidance is not Obvious" (Prov. 16:4). Just like Joseph in Gen. 50:20, it is often only in hindsight that we are able to clearly see God's guidance. Give an example of a time in your life where it wasn't obvious at the time but you are able to look back now and see God's guidance in your life.
- 5. How have you historically thought about God's guidance? Did this week's message present any new ideas to you or challenge anything about the way you previously thought?
- 6. The way we get the guidance that God gives is by trusting Him and committing to Him. And, as we trust Him, we are transformed into the type of person who gets guided. What is the most difficult part of trusting God for you? What helps you trust God?
- 7. This week was our final week in our series through Proverbs. Was there anything in this series that helped you grow in your love for God? Was there anything you were convicted about? Was there anything you learned in this series that you now aspire to do?
- 8. Easter is this Sunday! Normally we would be inviting family and friends to come with us to church, but this Easter will be different. However, you still have the ability to invite your friends and family to join us online or you could even host a Facebook watch party to reach as many of your friends as possible. You might be surprised who tunes in! Take some time to think about and pray about who you can invite to join us for Easter this Sunday.
