DISCUSSION QUESTIONS – Pick one or two of these to talk about as a group

1. What stood out to you most from this week's message? Why?
2. What are some of the various ways you've heard healing talked about in the church? Which views have been helpful to you and which haven't? Was your view of healing shaped or challenged by this week's message out of Acts 3?
3. One of the main ideas this week was that miracles point us to our deepest need. The lame man in Acts 3 was only asking for temporary improvement or distraction in his life when what Jesus offers is an entirely new life. What are some of your needs or desires that have taken more of your time and attention than they should? What do you think mankind's deepest need is?
4. The fact that Jesus didn't only forgive sin but also healed physical diseases is evidence that He cares about alleviating human suffering. Are you passionate about any particular means of alleviating suffering in the world? Is there any way that we, as a group, could support you in your efforts?
5. This week, Pastor Ryan said, "the resurrection is not a consolation for the life you lost but a restoration of a life you never had, but always wanted." What are some ways the resurrection can be an encouragement to us when we are facing disease and physical suffering?
6. What was most encouraging to you about this week's message?
7. Is there a physical ailment in your life or in the life of someone you love that we could pray for tonight?
