What are some ways this is happening in our world today? What types of people are the easiest for you to dehumanize in your heart and mind? How do we change?
- 5. It is easy to think that the way you use your material body has no effect on your soul. Do you agree or disagree with this idea? Why?
- 6. If you are a follower of Jesus you are called and equipped to care for all of human life, especially the most vulnerable. What opportunities has God given you to care for others? What are some ways God has uniquely equipped you to accomplish this calling?
