DISCUSSION QUESTIONS – Pick two or three of these to talk about as a group

1. What was most helpful for you from this week's message? Why?
2. This week's message was all about prayer. How would you describe your relationship with prayer throughout your life?
3. Daniel's life shows us that prayer should be both occasional and habitual. What is the current rhythm of your prayer life? What is the next step you could take toward improving your prayer habits?
4. Daniel's life also shows us that prayer should be both corporate and individual. Who do you pray with regularly? If you don't currently have anyone, who could you reach out to this week to set up a regular time of prayer with?
5. Daniel quotes scripture when praying. This shows us that prayer should be both your words and God's words. What are some of the reasons it is important to use scripture when we pray? Take time this week to read through a Psalm and then pray using the content of the Psalm to inform your prayer.
6. What has been your experience of the Holy Spirit in your prayer life? How do you know it is Him?
7. Do you know that you are greatly loved by God? If so, how do you know this? If not, what is keeping you from knowing this?
